



A Message from Chris Smith, JN District Commander



What is a Vessel Safety Check?


A vessel safety check is a courtesy examination of a boat to verify the presence and operable condition of certain safety equipment required by state and federal regulations. The Vessel Examiner is a trained specialist and is a member of America's Boating Club or the US Coast Guard Auxiliary. They will also make certain recommendations and discuss safety related issues that will make boat owners safer boaters.

The inspection is really quick and easy. Many trailerable boats can be inspected in ten minutes. All boaters will receive a copy of the evaluation form at the end of the inspection. Boats that meet the safety requirements will receive a current Vessel Safety Check decal to be displayed on board.




DISTRICT 3 GENEALOGY

By 1938 the United States Power Squadrons was an organization of 5,000 members with 33 squadrons. That year the Governing Board approved the establishment of 7 divisions and they appointed a Rear Commander to administer each division. Later the designation division was changed to District and in 1947 the officer in charge was changed to the elected position of District Commander.

The New York squadron had provided pre-charter instruction to the Brooklyn (1918) and South Shore (1928) squadrons. Brooklyn helped to establish Bay-

side (1936) which, in turn, spun-off Neptune (1938). District 3 was officially established on 13 December 1938 to include the Brooklyn, South Shore, Bayside, and Neptune squadrons. The district grew for thirty-five years reaching a peak in 1970 of over 5,000 members in 21 squadrons. With less interest in boating, membership declined drastically during the late 70s and early 80s, but the tide has turned and District 3 has again begun to grow. In 2019 District 3 now has 15 active squadrons.





DISTRICT 3 AWARDS AND TROPHIES

Cruise and Rendezvous Trophy

The present Cruise and Rendezvous Trophy, a large handsome trophy cup mounted on a two-tiered walnut pedestal, is a perpetual District 3 award presented annually at the Fall Conference for boating participation at the District Rendezvous. The winner of the trophy is determined by a formula that takes into account the distance traveled to the Rendezvous location, and the number of squadron boats in attendance relative to the total membership of a squadron.

The idea of a Cruise and Rendezvous Trophy was jointly conceived by the members of Patchogue Bay and Peconic Bay squadrons. The original trophy, donated by Peconic Bay Power Squadron in 1967, was to be an annual award with the stipulation that any squadron that won the award three times would be entitled to keep it. Patchogue Bay succeeded in winning the award in 1968, 1969, and 1970. Thus they took permanent possession of the original trophy. To continue the award the following year Patchogue Bay donated a new trophy for presentation with the same contest rules applying. It did not seem likely

that a squadron could dominate the competition again. However, Great South Bay Power Squadron achieved this winning the trophy in 1971, 1972, and 1973.

The following year, Great South Bay Power Squadron reinstated the award. This time, however, the "three consecutive wins" rule, entitling a squadron to keep the trophy, was dropped to assure that this would be a perpetual award. Great South Bay squadron purchased the present trophy and deeded it to the District in 1974. Great South Bay has gone on to win the award 29 of the 35 years, including seventeen years in a row. In 2014 Jones Beach won the award and in 2013, 2015 & 2016, 2017, and 2019 the trophy was won by Patchogue Bay. Recipient 2022: Captree



PRINCE HENRY AWARD

The seated likeness of Prince Henry the Navigator of Portugal was given to a number of USPS districts by the government of Portugal for promoting education in the art of navigation.

In D/3 this award is presented at the Spring Conference to the



squadron who had the highest percentage of members advance in grade. The recipient is determined by a point system that takes advanced grades relative to the total membership of the squadron. Recipient: 2022 Bayside

HAEDRICH MEMORIAL TROPHY

The Brooklyn Power Squadron established the Haedrich Memorial Bell Trophy in remembrance of Harold W. Haedrich who was a past commander Brooklyn Squadron and one of the original commanders of District 3. The ringing of the Haedrich bell traditionally opens and closes our district conferences.



The trophy is awarded at the Spring Conference based on a complex formula that takes into account advanced grades and elective courses completed and membership retention. Recipient: 2022 Patchogue Bay
